

A Parting Encouragement

Everyday Evangelism

When Jesus first spoke of evangelism to His disciples, He used the analogy of fishing. "Follow me," He declared, "and I will make ow fishers of men" (Matt. 4:19). Have you ever gone fishing? There are two ways to fish. You can throw a stick of dynamite into the lake and catch what you can, or you can become a fisher of men in the manner Jesus intended. A good fisherman gives time, thought, and patience to his craft; he does not quit if he loses the first fish that hits his line.

Effective evangelism is a way of life, not something limited to a weekend special effort. It is less the result of shrewd salesmanship and more the way we interact with those around us and develop loving relationships with them. All Christians can and should be evangelists. The Lord makes use of some unlikely evangelists before Peter converted thousands at Pentecost, he was brought to Jesus by his brother, Andrew. Andrew was always referred to in relation with his brother: "Andrew, Simon Peter's brother" (John 1:40; 6:8). Peter become the famous one, but with no Andrew, we would have had no Peter.

The Samaritan woman was also an unlikely evangelist. She was clearly the town outcast, fetching her water at noon, in the heat of the day, all alone. Hers was, to say the least, a colorful lifestyle with five husbands and a current live-in arrangement. Yet she brought a whole town to Jesus. Have you ever brought a whole town to Jesus?

Many Samaritans from that town believed in Him because she used a statistically proven evangelistic method and learned from a successful business mode. That isn't really what happened. John 4:42 tells us the words of the residents of Sychar: "It is no longer because of what you said that we believe, for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is indeed the Savior of the world."

THE INVISIBLE PEOPLE

It seems that for many Christians, people who need the Lord are invisible. The rich man suffered from this sort of blindness: "And at his gate was laid a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who desired to be fed with what fell from the rich man's table" (Luke 16:20-21).

When you walk down the hall, did you see a custodian, a student, a teacher, or did you see a soul with an eternal destiny? And if so, did you see the part you might play in that final destiny?

SIX REASONS TO SAVE A SOUL

- 1. Because Christ thought it was important. Jesus saw saving souls as His major mission. "I must preach the good news of the kingdom of God," He explained, "for I was sent for this purpose" (Luke 4:43). Later He declared, "The Son of Man came to seek and save the lost" (Luke 19:10). Paul believed this was Jesus' primary purpose: "Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the foremost" (I Tim. 1:15). Saving soul was Jesus' central task, and we are to follow in His footsteps. What are our priorities? How dare we have priorities that differ from His.
- 2. Because of the supreme value of one soul. Jesus pondered over the value of a human soul in Matt. 16:26: "For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world and forfeits his soul? Or what shall a man give in return for his soul?" These are supposed to be rhetorical questions. The answer should be "Gaining the world and losing my soul would be a terrible trade!" "Absolutely nothing would be worth an exchange for my soul!" Jesus, the Shepherd, is depicted as going

to great lengths to find and rescue just one sheep (Luke 15:4). We're in the 'people business'. Everyone we meet is an opportunity for service and outreach.

- 3. Because a lost soul will die. Lost souls will die. Scripture emphasized this: "the soul who sins shall die" (Ezek . 18:1-4). "The wages of sin", Paul warned, "is death' (Rom. 6:23). In this politically correct age, we fear to say the lost will die, but our fear does not make this any less true.
- 4. Because there is a Judge. The only factor that matters is that at the end of time the Lord will judge the living and the dead. Everything we say and do should be carried out with this truth in mind. Neither property, fame, nor wealth will matter when we meet our Maker. "All nations will be gathered before Him" (Matt. 25:32). Each of us "will give an account for our actions" (Rom. 14:12). God calls on "all people, everywhere to repent" (Acts 17:29-31). "We must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ" (2 Cor. 5:10). No one is exempt; anglicans and atheists, film stars and janitors everyone will one day face the Judge of all the earth.
- 5. Because we have gospel. "Simon Peter answered him, 'Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life'" (John 6:68). This is less a declaration of arrogance than one of gratitude; we have the gospel. It has been given to us, and it is up to us to share it. We to whom much has been given must give much. We are ambassadors for Christ (2 Cor. 5:20). The gospel (and only the gospel) is the "power of God for salvation to everyone who believes" (Rom. 1:16). Churches that preach something less than the gospel are holding out one their neighbors and friends.
- 6. Because time is short. There is an urgency to our sharing the gospel (James 4:14). Today is the right time to respond to the gospel. Therefore, today is the best time to proclaim it (2 Cor. 6:1-2). Time is precious. Do you know someone who needs to hear the gospel? Then share it while you have the opportunity.

How to Reach Others

1. *Invite them.* Invite friends and family to church. You do have to ask to get people to come to worship. Your friends and neighbors will likely not come unless you invite them

If your invitation is declined, be patient. God has a way of changing circumstances they may be open to your invitation next time.

Be consistent. If your Christianity is not the real thing, they won't follow your lead.

When you see a visitor in worship, approach him and introduce yourself. Your friends can wait for a few minutes while you do this. Better, have your friends come over and introduce themselves, too.

Build relationships. This is where the whole congregation comes in. If a newcomer can latch on to two friends, they will probably remain.

These exhortations are aimed at the motive for every-day evangelism. Placing guilt trips on members is an insufficient motivational factor for church members; so is an artificial atmosphere of cheerleading. A thorough understanding of the biblical reasons why we should save a soul, however, will drive us all to bring the Lord to our communities on a day-to-day basis.
