WOO! PIG! SOOIEE!

One of my favorite gifts, given to me by my children in acknowledgement and support of a, perhaps, unhealthy allegiance and obsession, has a place of honor in my office. It's a large plastic hat, red and in the shape of a Razorback Hog, traditionally worn by similarlyobsessed people who are privileged to follow the University of Arkansas Sports. I am a Hog Fan.

I can't expect you to understand. I don't really understand. I only know I've always loved my Hogs. In 1964, before I was five years old, they won their first (and only) National Football Championship (Yeah. I know. Alabama claims the same thing in the same year. They are wrong). Ever since then, my mood has risen or fallen, depending on the fortunes of 85 young men, all of whom I have never met. I suppose my favorite moment was the 1978 Orange Bowl, in which we were expected to be shellacked by the Oklahoma Sooners. The result? 31-6, Arkansas.

But the question remains. How was I "sold" to go "all-in" on the Razorbacks, with parents that were from Texas and Florida and a hometown team at Harding University? After all, even with some notable victories, the program pretty much, has been "middle of the road"? A few keys:

Passionate Repetition. Visible signs of the love my neighbors had for the Hogs were everywhere. T-shirts. Bumper Stickers. Buttons. Even out at church camp, where the most popular craft item was a plaster-paris Razorback, snorting and spitting angrily at whatever was in its way. Everybody was a Hog Fan in my home state.

<u>Positive Messaging</u>. Some might even call it "propaganda". The whole state was sold on the virtues of their boys. Every article written by

every sportswriter in the state presented our team as the "best and brightest" and most gifted on the college scene. Our boys were more wholesome than theirs. More talented. Just "better" – even when they lost. In fact, we never lost. The refs cheated!

Reputable Leadership. The coach, Frank Broyles, was skilled at promotion and understood that for his team to be loved, he needed to be loved as well. He understood the importance of a good reputation in building the program, and did the right things to build things in the right way. Even in his nineties and four decades removed from his coaching days, he was still likely the most beloved man in the state. He could have run for governor and been elected. But he couldn't afford the pay cut!

<u>A Few Memorable Victories</u>, most notable being that 1978 Orange Bowl.

That's how I was sold, as a youngster, on the Razorbacks. But that story also illustrates some fundamentals of reaching out in the name of Jesus. For example, what about our passion? Are we passionate about Christ? Are we were committed to presenting Christ and his church in the most positive light? Are we who aspire to leadership also aspiring to the blameless life, an essential in a cynical world?

I believe if we were to prioritize these things, folks might listen to us more attentively. Consider your passion and your willingness to share the gospel over and over. Are you sharing in a positive manner? Is your reputation detracting from the message? Can you point to victories the Lord has given you over the years? Think about it. And make a change.
