THE VOICE

I remember the first time I heard Whitney Houston sing. I'd never heard anything like it. She had such a big voice, such a beautiful voice. I became a fan almost instantly.

She was a star at eighteen years old. Her mother was a Grammy-Award-Winning Gospel singer. Her aunt, Dionne Warwick, was a singing star in her own right in the sixties and seventies, teaming with composer Burt Bacharach to record several big hits. Her godmother? Aretha Franklin.

Whitney Houston was music royalty, born to privilege, gifted mightily and trained well to rule the world of music. And rule she did, for many years. Her rendition of "The Star-Spangled Banner" has changed, perhaps forever, the way schoolgirls all over this great land try to sing it (sadly, for the worse, because few have the "pipes" to do what she did).

Success followed success, for years, until she met the wrong man and started traveling down his road. Seduced by drugs and alcohol, the combined wealth of Whitney Houston and Bobby Brown, her husband, only served to enslave them more. She couldn't "kick the habit", drowning in her bathtub after taking drugs. Years later, her daughter died in a very similar way as did her mother. Having been found unconscious in the bathtub after taking drugs and alcohol, she lingered for a few months in a coma, then passed away. Heartbreaking.

A wise friend of mine who passed away a few years ago was fond of saying, "Stay out of those places." I wish Whitney Houston had done so, along with so many other artists who, led astray by the lust of the flesh, died early. It's "the same old story", names changing but the plot remaining the same. One generation's Hank Williams is another generation's Elvis. One generation's John Belushi is another generation's Chris Farley. One generation's Janis Joplin is another generation's Whitney Houston. And on it goes.

Scripture warns us well: "Do not be deceived: 'Bad company ruins good morals.'" (1 Cor. 15:33); "Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the wicked, nor stands in the way of sinners, nor sits in the seat of scoffers;" (Proverbs 1:1); "Whoever walks with the wise becomes wise, but the companion of fools will suffer harm." (Proverbs 13:20); "Make no friendship with a man given to anger, nor go with a wrathful man, lest you learn his ways and entangle yourself in a snare." (Proverbs 22:24-25). Hopefully, the warning encapsulated in these Biblical Admonitions are easily understood.

Sadly, far too many, by choosing the wrong friends, allow ruination. You have the freedom to choose your associates. Please don't let them lead you down a dangerous path.
