### HAPPY THANKSGIVING!

"Oh, give thanks to the Lord, for He is good! For His mercy endures forever."

Psalm 107:1

"Whereas it is the duty of all nations to acknowledge the providence of Almighty God, to obey His will, to be grateful for His benefits, and humbly to implore His protection and favor . . ." – George Washington, Thanksgiving Day Proclamation, 1789

With these words, Washington, following traditions that had been around since the arrival of the colonists in the 1600s, gave notice to the world that citizens of these United States should understand and acknowledge their Father's bountiful blessings; and that Americans should obey Him in response.

Many years earlier, in the early days of another nation, God, speaking directly to Moses, gave instructions for the Feast of Tabernacles, perhaps the original "Thanksgiving." Some speculate that many Thanksgiving traditions were learned in Holland from Jews, who like the Pilgrims, had been driven there by persecution. In this Feast, all Israel remembers, by living in "tabernacles" (tents – or booths), how God delivered them from Egypt, making them live in tents for a time before bringing them into the Promised Land. The Lord wanted to make sure His people remembered two things: (1) that He had delivered them from Egypt; and (2) that He also required them to live in those tents for a time. They had to remember both deliverance and discipline; the Exodus and the Wandering. And in this feast, Israel taught the world that all

should thank and honor God, who delivers us and also disciplines us (Leviticus 23:33-43).

On that first Thanksgiving Day in America, were we fully formed and perfect as a nation? Are we now? No. And no. Like Israel of old, sometimes we Americans fall under God's heavy hand of discipline; and sometimes we walk in great blessings, protection and provision. We Americans are still a "work in progress." We have much to be thankful for; we have much work to do.

That said, I love the fact that our ancestors acknowledged "the Author and Finisher of our faith" early in our national story (Hebrews 12:2). I am grateful that our ancestors, early, gave glory to God, who ". . . has made from one blood every nation of men to dwell on all the face of the earth, and has determined their preappointed times and the boundaries of their dwellings . . ." (Acts 17:26).

We, on our good days, do the same. On our good days we are grateful for His blessings, provision, protection and, even discipline. On our good days we recognize that it is He who has built the house in which we dwell and He who will protect it, should we endure.

May we have more good days in which we remember Him. May we remember; be thankful; and obey.

Our Purpose
"And one of the scribes came up and heard them disputing with one another, and seeing that he answered them well, asked him, "Which commandment is the most important of all?" Jesus answered, "The most important is, 'Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. And you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' The second is this: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these." And the scribe said to him, "You are right, Teacher. You have truly said that he is one, and there is no other besides him. And to love him with all the heart and with all the understanding and with all the strength, and to love one's neighbor as oneself, is much more than all whole burnt offerings and sacrifices."
