## HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY!

I wish you could've met my mother, as well as Kimberly's. They were special ladies; very different, but also very much the same. Similar, I suppose, to many other mothers.

Both Dorothy (Kim's mom) and Kathryn (my mom) had difficult childhoods (they were children of the Great Depression), though from different points of view (mom's as a hard-working farm girl in the rural South; Dorothy's as a child in the city, but on her own much too soon).

Both Dorothy and Kathryn were athletes (basketball). Dorothy was a defensive specialist; my mother could shoot – and score – from anywhere. Dorothy was a great dancer, invited to travel with Count Basie's band (about to get married and start a family, she declined). Mom's brush with fame? Her classmate – and date to the prom – was Pat Summerall, who was just another kid in Lake City, Florida at the time, but made a name for himself playing football at Arkansas and with the New York Giants, followed by a long and distinguished career in sports broadcasting.

Both Dorothy and Kathryn were determined. Strong-willed. Stubborn. And good. To both, their children were everything. And they did whatever they could to bless each one of them. But their love was not limited to those born of their marriage. Both Dorothy and Kathryn took in the children of relatives who were going through hard times, the result being that both Kimberly and I have cousins who are more like brothers and sisters than cousins. Some

would call such an arrangement strange or inconvenient. Kim – and I – called it "home".

Neither Dorothy nor Kathryn thought their jobs were done once we kids had left home. They were always right there at the other end of the telephone line. Listening. Offering advice. Encouragement. A needed "kick in the pants" if the situation warranted. My mother's signature phrase? "Did you count it all joy?" (James 1:2) Kinda hard to complain when you know that will be the response! And Dorothy's? "Don't say 'good-bye'. Say 'so long'. 'Good-bye' sounds too final."

I suppose the most important similarity they shared was their faith in God. My mother, raised in church, always had an irrepressible faith that grew stronger as she grew older. Dorothy wasn't raised in church and was NOT happy when Kimberly got baptized ("Not you! You're the sensible one!"). But she listened to her daughters and the Bible and was baptized into Christ at age 65. Like my mother, Dorothy's faith grew stronger as she grew older. And I believe that a key reason I am a preacher today is that those good women (and Kimberly) kept on praying for me until I heeded the call to "Go to Nineveh." (Jonah 1:2)

I am grateful to have known two great mothers in my lifetime. One who raised me; one who "adopted" me as I learned how to bless her daughter. May their tribe increase.
